

REIGATE AND DISTRICT SNOOKER LEAGUE
BURGESS CUP/PLATE 'SINGLES' AND KEN WINCHESTER 'PAIRS' RULES

1. The Competitions to be called the "Burgess Cup" and the "Ken Winchester Trophy". The "Burgess Plate" singles competition was introduced in 2005 only for players outside of the top division. If there is only one division, then losers of their first match in the Burgess Cup will be entered into the Burgess Plate. Players who concede a match are not eligible to be entered.
2. The entry fee per player/pair shall be established each year at the A.G.M.
3. Entry shall be restricted to registered league players only.
4. Matches up to the Semi-Finals to be the best of Three Frames, the Semi- Finals of the singles & Final of the Pairs to be the best of Five Frames. The final of the Burgess Cup will be the best of seven frames and the final of Burgess Plate will be the best of five frames. Matches will be played at the venue of the first named player/pair out of the draw, apart from all Finals, which will be played on Finals Day (Subject to availability).
5. The Home player/pair must give their opponent(s) a **minimum of three dates**, not more than two dates in any one-week, at least **Ten days** before the completion date of any round. The Home player/pair to arrange markers up to the semi-finals.
6. Failure to give your opponent(s) three dates at least ten days before the closing date entitles them to **claim the match**.
7. All matches to be recorded on a result card supplied by the home player/pair. The winner(s) are responsible for sending in the result to the League Secretary within three days of the match being played. Failure to record the match on a result card and/or send in the result card to the League Secretary will result in player(s) being eliminated from the competition. Postal Results only accepted, no phone calls entertained.
NO CARD= NO POINTS, NO BREAKS
8. Any objections to a tie must be forwarded to the League Secretary in writing within 48hrs of the match being played.
9. A **closing date** for each round will be given and this will be **strictly adhered** to.
10. The W.S.A. rules of snooker will apply to all games, (except the miss rule).
11. Entry by any competitor implies acceptance of the above rules.
12. Anything not covered by these rules will be dealt with by the League Secretary on behalf of the committee.
